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### ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22

Sometime in the second week of March 2020 the state governments across the country began shutting down schools and colleges temporarily as a measure to contain the spread of the novel coronavirus. With no immediate solution to stop the outbreak of the pandemic, colleges remained closed for months, which affected the teaching learning process.

Though the two-year lockdown had brought everything to a standstill, we at DBMS College Of Education moved forward quickly and responded to the threat so that our students could continue their progress in terms of their learning outcomes. We have come out with various initiatives to respond to Covid 19 challenges so that the delay in our academic schedule is minimized without impacting the studies for students.

The academic session 2020 -22 which was to start in July 2020 was delayed by almost 10 months and we could start our classes in 2021 March due to the pandemic. The admission process was completed by the Jharkhand Combined Entrance Examination Board with five merit lists sent by them in long intervals .The students came to college very hesitatingly. It was a challenge to convince them to attend regular classes. We began orientation of this batch on 22nd March 2021. A number of events were organised offline and online throughout the year.

Within the given constraints, an elaborate internship programme was planned and rolled out for students. Some of the significant steps taken were as follows:

- Conducted online classes as starting point to understand technical and other concerns of students to deliver online lessons.
- Teachers prepared a separate time table for online classes and followed the schedule for the session 2019-21.
- Tele and group counselling was provided to students during the pandemic.

Faculty Development Programme was organized which included the following sessions:

- Re-orienting Internship Practice: Understanding School Experiences of Covid-19'.
- Use of Tools in Online Teaching' by Dr Manoj Kumar
- Lecture on 'Managing Online Classrooms' by Sangeeta Ravi
- Online Micro teaching workshop by Dr Sandhya Sinha

All sessions were recorded for referencing purposes if needed. Stationary was converted into soft copies and were customized to suit online teaching. Students could collect hard copies from college if they wished to. Online guidance was organized. Librarian Nickey Singh shared PDF of important chapters online.

The college organized various webinars and workshops in association with renowned resource persons throughout the year. The workshops ranged around various subjects of communicative English, storytelling, art and painting etc.

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### **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES :-**

### > THEORY, LECTURES AND EVALUATION:-

Every year B.Ed. students of our college observe Tagore Jayanti. Students recited Tagore's poetry on **May 8**, **2021**. It was an online event in which the Principal and the management members also participated. Rabindranath Tagore's poems, songs and stories were recited. His life and achievements were very well presented by the students. Mrs Amrita Choudhary, our Music Teacher, had organised the programme. Students also presented a short skit on the occasion. Arpita, Ruby, Milan, Shweta, Gargi, Dipesh, Nitesh played an active role in organising the event successfully. The students have studied Tagore's educational philosophy in B. Ed so they could easily connect with the event.

In memory of eminent Hindi Scholar Padmashri Dr Shailendra Nath Shrivastav An Inter college debate competition was organised on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2021 in collaboration with Sanskar Bharti Jamshedpur, This

It was a grand success. Newcomers were also motivated by their seniors to perform in coming events and win prizes. #### > LECTURES AND WORKSHOPS BY RESOURCE PERSONS:-

The Principal and faculty members along with the students attended the workshop and gained knowledge. It's a challenge to keep students concentration in virtual mode for a long time. Mrs Sunita Sinha shared the nuances of how to handle children of lower classes in an online mode. She used various teaching aids which can be used in online teaching. It was a very interesting session which was appreciated by one and all .

The IQAC had organised a **session on inclusive education** in college auditorium September 2021in which Academic Counselor of DBMS Kadma School, Mrs Meena Bugli and Rajesh Mohanty were the panellists . Chief Guest, Mrs Tasleem Sultana suggested that the challenged child should be helped in becoming economically independent. Mr Rajesh Mohanty said that to control the specially disabled child one must stoop down to his level to understand him. We should empathise with the challenged child instead of sympathising. 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**Workshop On E- Waste** A workshop on E- waste was conducted in collaboration with Hulladek recycling agency in the DBMS auditorium on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2021. What is e- waste and what happens to the outdated mobiles and desktops, etc. was very well explained to the B Ed students. They benefitted by knowing that these e- waste can be collected from our neighbourhood and given for recycling. Many of the students did not know about it. The principal said that e- waste management is essential for the environment and we should be make people aware of it. Shruti , Hulladek's representative explained in detail the electronic appliances which are e- waste and how JUSCO has taken the initiative of collecting and recycling it. The next generation will thank yoy for the disposal of e waste which is harmful for all of us . **Blood donation** camp was organised on 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 in which the students of our college played a very active role. They called the donors and collected 30 units of blood. The Blood Bank of Jamshedpur had provided doctors and medical staff. The students got their haemoglobin tested. The faculty members and the principal also donated blood for a noble cause. DBMS Trust has its own educational units in which the students were sent for internship for a short period when there was relaxation in lockdown. Some B. Ed students taught D El Ed students to have confidence in teaching.

**PARENT TEACHER MEETING :**The college principal generally calls the guardians of students who are not very regular in classes or those who are weak in studies. After covid 19 there were some financial issues too in which the Principal had to call the parents and solve the matter with the management members. The Principal and management had to allow them to pay fee in easy instalments. The internal exam marks were



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discussed with the guardians and remedial teaching was suggested to Sagarika Mukherjee, Sonali Pramanik, and Sahu

**LIBRARY :-** Vast collection of books, journals, encyclopaedia, dictionaries, magazines and newspapers in both Hindi and English are available in the library. Comfortable reading and writing tables for students use are provided.

The library of DBMS College has 5000 books on Education which are used extensively by the students and teachers. The books are issued digitally by the librarian. Besides textbooks it also has journals, encyclopaedias, subject dictionaries and variety of other books donated by our well-wishers. All library operations (acquisition, circulation, cataloguing, serials control etc.) were carried out by library staff during the year.

**PLACEMENT CELL:-** College was established in 2018 August .The first batch passed out in 2020 . This batch was hard hit by Covid 19 which lead to country wide lockdown in March 2020. All the schools were closed and our students could not apply anywhere in the state. When the lockdown was relaxed the schools and colleges remained closed only University office , and college office was working in rotation. In 2021 when the schools started opening there was no vacancy for freshers. Our students were de motivated and discouraged . Despite the gloomy scenario our students gradually started getting jobs in schools. DBMS College students were in demand and by the end of 2021 30 percent of our students of 2018-20 and 2019-21 session started working!.

**Mentoring by Teachers:** This was the only batch in which we had only 23 students. This session was mostly online. Soon after the girls joined B. ED lockdown was declared and students stayed indoors. We had to conduct most of the classes online. all activities were held online so the students were not able to enjoy college life. They used to be very sad about this and often used to complain about the situation. These girls were mostly from hindi medium background, were married and belonged to middle class



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families. They were eager to do B Ed as soon as possible but late admission, delayed exams and results shattered their dreams . The following teachers mentored the students of 2019-21 batch and helped them getting placement in schools . The Principal, Dr Joohi Samarpita herself guided each student in facing interview and recommending good schools. Personal counselling was given by her as and when needed.

Another student was from south India and hesitated in speaking in Hindi. She could speak English with a heavy accent of Tamil. With encouragement by principal to be the anchor in college event she gained confidence and was very actively involved in online classes.
