Mrs Bhanumati Neelkanthan the Chairperson of DBMS Trust had a long cherished dream of establishing a college which could produce ideal teachers, and her dream was fulfilled in 2018. After being recognised by NCTE it was given affiliation by Kolhan University too.

The admission process started in June 2018 and within a month all hundred seats were full. We had orientation of the first batch on 10.7. 2019 and regular classes started from the next day.
