Under the Placement cell of DBMS College of Education had organized a three day Placement workshop. Different eminent resource person were invited to guide our B.Ed 4th semester students.

Day 1-16/10/23

Topic – **How to write a cover letter with CV.**

Resource person- Mrs. Sangeeta Samanth, consultant British Council & Library

Time- 10am- 12pm

On the first day of workshop Mrs. Sangeeta Samanth the resource person spoke on crafting effective cover letters, CVs, resumes, and biodata emphasizing their significance in the job application process. The session began with an introduction to the purpose and structure of each document. The guest speaker emphasized the importance of a well-tailored cover letter that aligns with the job description, grabs the employer's attention, and showcases the applicant's qualifications. Similarly, the CV, resume, and biodata were discussed, highlighting how they present an applicant's educational and professional background. She shared with the students some examples of cover letter. Attendees left with a deeper understanding of these essential documents, better equipped to make a positive impression in job applications.

Day 2 began with session of Mrs. Rama Srinivasan who spoke about the importance of resume writing. She begin the principal shared her side of the story and process of resume selection for calling the person for interview. She made our B.Ed students list down some common errors which one must avoid. She stressed on avoiding spelling mistakes, not to tell lies in resume, including your extra curricular activities in resume, highest qualification should come first in educational qualification, the difference between educational and professional qualification. She gave her life experience on different types of candidates that she has come across. The session helped our students gain a practical exposure and some tips to follow in interview and while writing resume.

In the next session we had Mrs.Nargis Madan as the speaker. Her session was about how to face interview. She emphasized the significance of thorough preparation, including knowing the school's mission, values, and curriculum. She stressed the importance of indepth content knowledge, sitting postures and innovative methods of teaching. Mrs. Nargis also highlighted the need to articulate a



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commitment to student development and a positive classroom environment. Furthermore, she encouraged attendees to practice responses to common interview questions. Overall, her guidance empowered prospective teachers to confidently approach teaching job interviews, ensuring they leave a favorable impression on prospective employers.
