INTRODUCTION

She discussed various aspects of effective self-presentation, including body posture, voice modulation, facial expressions, and walking style. These elements were highlighted as essential tools for maintaining students' attention and delivering lessons effectively. The importance of understanding the situation in which one is "acting" was emphasized, encouraging teachers to adapt their behavior according to classroom contexts.

A major focus of the session was on developing presence of mind, which enables teachers to respond confidently and appropriately in dynamic classroom situations. The resource person also explained how drama techniques can be integrated into the teaching-learning process to make lessons more interactive, engaging, and meaningful.

An interesting segment of the session explored how breathing exercises enhance voice quality. Participants were introduced to the 4-7-8 breathing technique, a simple yet effective method to control breath, improve voice clarity, and reduce anxiety before speaking.

The most engaging part of the session involved role-play and enactment activities. Students were given different situations and roles, and they had to perform accordingly. This activity helped participants experience real-life classroom scenarios, boosting their confidence, creativity, and spontaneity.

OUTCOME

The session was highly impactful and well-received by all participants. Student-teachers gained valuable insights into the importance of expression, communication, and confidence in teaching. They learned how drama and performance skills can make classroom interactions more lively and effective.

The practical activities, especially role-playing, helped students overcome hesitation and develop better stage presence. The session also enhanced their understanding of voice control and body language, making them more prepared for real classroom teaching. Overall, the programme successfully highlighted that teaching is not just about delivering content but about engaging, expressing, and connecting with learners effectively.
